Significant Humanitarian Facts



Currently, only 7 out of 19 bakeries in Gaza remain operational. Among these, 4 are located in Gaza City, 2 in Deir al-Balah in the central region, and 1 in Khan Younis in the south. The flour supplies in these bakeries are expected to be depleted soon. (4)



The food security situation in the Gaza Strip is worsening daily, with over one million individuals having not received any food parcels since July or in prior months, particularly in the central and southern regions of the territory. (5)



Since the onset of Israeli military operations in northern Gaza on October 6, 2024, all requests from relief partner organizations for the delivery of essential supplies and fuel for water, sanitation, and hygiene facilities have been rejected. This has heightened the risk of dehydration and disease outbreaks, while approximately half of the wells in Gaza City remain inaccessible. (5)

Risks threatening Gaza Strip



There has been a significant rise in the number of households facing severe hunger, prompting individuals to adopt more drastic coping mechanisms for survival, such as decreasing the food intake of adults to ensure that children receive nourishment. The availability of wheat flour has also diminished considerably, with the cost of a 25-kilogram bag soaring to 400 shekels (over 100\$), a sharp increase from 40 shekels (approximately 10\$) prior to October. The United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) has reported that children in the Gaza Strip are enduring harsh conditions characterized by skin diseases, an unhealthy environment, and ongoing violence. The United Nations has indicated that Gaza's markets are devoid of sterilizers, sanitizers, and personal hygiene products due to significant barriers preventing the entry of essential supplies into the region.



The United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA) has reported that over 65,000 Palestinians are enduring inhumane conditions in northern Gaza as a result of relentless Israeli airstrikes and the lack of basic living necessities. The statement highlighted the "scale of death, destruction, and deprivation" experienced by the local population.
